# **Editorial Policy and Instructions for Authors**

Editorial Policy: In 2004, the Graduate School of Kuroshio Science was established at Kochi University to study the bioresources, environment, and human health conditions in the area under the influence of the Kuroshio, one of the world's largest ocean current. To achieve our mission, we have been publishing the journal Kuroshio Science twice a year since 2007 so as to cover the integrated arts and sciences including science, society, and culture related to the Kuroshio area beyond the borders of the established field of sciences. Please visit the URL:http://kuroshio.cc.kochiu.ac.jp/en/index.html Contributions may take the form of Original Research Articles, Research Notes, Review Articles and news such as activities and attractions to facilitate the international exchange of results.

Submission: Kuroshio Science invites authors to submit the manuscripts via postal mail or email. Authors are requested to submit the manuscripts that may not be under consideration for publication elsewhere. In case sending the manuscripts via postal mail, please submit the original and three copies of the manuscript, including tables and figures with the address, e-mail address, telephone and fax numbers of the corresponding author.

Acceptance: The acceptance criteria for all papers are the quality and originality of the research and its significance to our readership. Except where otherwise stated, manuscripts are peer reviewed by two anonymous reviewers (chosen by the Editor and Associate Editors) and the Editor. The Editorial board reserves the right to refuse any material for publication and advises that authors should retain copies of submitted manuscripts and correspondence as materials cannot be returned. Final acceptance or rejection rests with the Editor.

**Proofs**: One set of page proofs will be sent to the corresponding author to be checked. Only minor changes are allowed at this stage. Proofs should be returned within 48 hours.

Electronic submission: Electronic submission of the

manuscript is not acceptable. Only the final accepted manuscript is allowed to be submitted by computer disk with information on the software.

**Reprints**: It is free of charge for submission, publication, and 50 reprints. Additional reprints will be charged: they may be ordered at the time of acceptance of proofs. Reprints ordered after the issue is printed will be charged at a higher rate.

Copyright agreement: The copyright to any published article in Kuroshio Science belongs to the Graduate School of Kuroshio Science, Kochi University. Usage of published articles in Kuroshio Science to any extent requires written permission of the Dean of Graduate School of Kuroshio Science. It is an exception to the above rule to use the published articles in scientific and educational purposes by acknowledging the source.

### Preparation of manuscript

- 1. Language: The official languages of Kuroshio Science are Japanese and English. Japanese articles should start with the abstract in Japanese followed by an English abstract at the end of the paper. If authors want to publish in other languages, please consult with the editors in advance. Authors are required to edit language before submission.
- **2. Length:** There is no fixed limitation to the length of a paper. If necessary, editorial office may suggest to authors the change of content, length, and category.
- **3. Text**: Type the entire manuscript including text, tables, references, and figure legends double spaced on A4 paper with 3 cm margins on both sides, top and bottom.
- **4. Title**: Supply the title in less than 25 words and a running title of less than 30 characters.
- **5. Authors name**: Full name of all authors must be described. No abbreviations are allowed.
- **6. First page**: On the first page, give the title of the paper, names of authors, institutional affiliations, and the name of the author to whom correspondence should be directed with complete address, e-mail address, telephone and fax numbers.
- **7. Abstract**: On the second page, supply an abstract of 250 words, stating the aims, methodology, results, and conclusions drawn from the study. At the end of the Abstract, supply 5 keywords.
- 8. Styles of original papers: Abstracts must be followed by the introduction, methodology (materials and methods), results, discussions, acknowledgments, references, tables and figure legends. Other articles must be consisted with numbered chapters. The first author's last name should

- appear on each page. Please follow the protocol described herein to avoid delay in publication. Authors should note that manuscripts may be edited if necessary.
- 9. Abbreviations, terms: Abbreviations and terms are subject to the customs in each field. Type a space between a digit and a unit (1 mM) except 1%, 4°C. Use S.E.M. for standard error and S.D. for standard deviation. Genes' names are in italic type and protein names are in roman type.
- 10. Numerical formulas: Numerical formulas are in italic type. When inserted into a sentence, they should be indicated by red print. Make one line space before and after the numerical formula.
- 11. Tables: Tables are in Arabic numbers and must be placed after References in a separate A4 page for each table. Each table must have a title on top of each. Footnotes must be shown as \*, \*\*, \*\*\* in upper cases at each place. Write down the footnotes at the bottom of each table.
- **12. Figures**: Figures must be prepared as the exact size in the printed page. Indicate the orientation and the number of each figure on the back of each figure with the first author's name.
- **13. Position of Figures and Tables**: Indicate the position where a Figure or a Table should be inserted by writing an arrow at the right hand side of the text. When you cite a Figure or a Table, you must mention them as Fig. 1 or Table 1 in the text.

- 15. Citing papers in the text: In the text, give the author's name followed by the year in parentheses: Sango (2000). If there are two authors, use 'and': Baskin and Baskin (1998). When reference is made to a work by three or more authors, the first name followed by et al. should be used: Powles et al. (1999). Citing papers in the text, list works by name of author(s) chronologically, beginning with the earliest date of publication in parentheses: (Kaufman 1974; Sy and Tsurufuji 1982). When citing a paper by more than two authors and two papers in the same year or consecutive years, put as (Smith et al. 1996a, b; Jackson et al. 1995, 1996).
- **16. Citing literatures in languages except English**: Write titles translated into English or write in roman letters when there is no official translation into English.
- **17.** Citing journals in languages other than English: Write in roman letters. If there is a translated name of a journal into English, cite the translated one.
- 18. Citation of unpublished work: should be cited in the text only, and not in a reference list (our unpublished data). Personal communications: the unpublished observations by other scientists must not be added without substantiated by written permission.
- 19. Manuscripts accepted for publication: list in References as (in press).
- 20. Copyright: In citing figures or tables whose publication rights are assigned to other publishers, obtain the written permission for each item from the publishers. Authors must describe the fact in the figure legends or table footnotes that permission from the publishers are obtained. Authors must also add the original articles from which they copy the figures or tables in the Reference list by certifying the permission from the publishers.
